Student's Responsibilities

Bring to class daily:

- 3-ring Binder with lined paper
- Textbook (to be kept home unless told to bring to class on a particular day)
- Sharpened PENCILS and erasers
- Homework notebook
- A graphing calculator – TI-83 or TI-84 ONLY (regular or plus)
 - You will be given very specific directions in class that only work with the TI-83/TI-84.
 - The graphing calculator will be used **every day** and is mandatory for tests & quizzes.

Attendance

If you are absent:

- Extra copies of worksheets will be available in the classroom for you to take when absent. It is your responsibility to make up all work and seek extra help if needed.
- As outlined in your student handbook...
 - If absent on a test/quiz day, you **MUST** take it the day you come back.
 - If absent on a review day, you must take the test/quiz the day you come back.
- You can always email me for a copy of the review & answers – This is **your** responsibility.

Lateness

- You must be seated & ready to work when the bell rings.

After one warning, being late to class will cause you to get detention.

Homework

- You will receive a homework notebook of which you should only be completing your stat homework in.
- Do not staple anything in your HW notebook or put any papers in the notebook.
- You do not have to copy down the homework problems; instead label which assignment it is and write down your answers.
- Homework is assigned and reviewed daily. Be sure to correct your homework by taking notes and reworking problems at home.
- HW notebooks are randomly collected with no warning, graded for completeness and correctness. You must show all work to receive full credit.
- If absent the day your HW notebook is collected, you may hand it in the next day without losing any credit.
- If you do not have your notebook on the day it is collected, you may hand it in the next day for half credit. Handing it in any days after that will result in a grade of a zero.

Grading Policy

- Major Assessments (tests, quizzes, and projects) – 75%
- Minor Assessments (homework notebook, video guides, classwork, etc.) – 25%
- Midterm/Final: each 10% of final course grade
